








Mobile Phones

- We are 'a no phones school'
- During term 6 this year we will be transitioning to using 'Yondr' pouches across the school, so when year 6 join us in Year 7 they will be the last year group to be inducted in using the pouch use during their transition with us
- There has been a significant amount of work done on this over the last year and you can see our FAQ's below
- We want our students to focus on building relationships with each other and their learning in the classroom without distractions
- Student's phones will remain with them during the school day but in their pouches – therefore they will have them to and from school if you wish them to
- We have medical pouches for students who require their phones for monitoring purposes, for example our diabetic students
- The school has plenty of IT facilities and so when IT is required for learning in school then students will have access to the appropriate resources







Keeping You Informed

We communicate regularly with parents through a variety of means

- Weekly parent communication from me highlighting activities that have taken place at the school
- Reminders about events coming up

Termly Newsletters

• We send termly newsletters to celebrate the many achievements of our students and to keep parents in the loop about the types of activities that take place across the school

Parent Information Evenings

Bullying and peer conflict



Our school definition of bullying is: Repetitive intentional hurting of one person or a group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online.

We ask students to speak to their house team or log a concern remotely on our student concern log so that an allegation can be promptly investigated. It is our experience that prompt reporting allows unkind behaviour to be addressed immediately. Restorative conversations, sanctions — and in repeat cases - Behaviour Contracts linked to the school Behaviour Level System, and external mediation are interventions that have proved to be successful.

We also have a whole school focus on kindness in the community and our Safeguarding Lead is currently working with the student body to write a student-friendly version of the Anti-bullying section of the School's Behaviour Policy.

Most of the student concerns that we receive relate to unkindness on social media, so again we welcome conversations at home about online safety and access to/monitoring of age-appropriate sites.

Supporting less confident/anxious students



- Year 7 spaces throughout the full first year 3G pitch, Elliot Hall
- A wide variety of extra-curricular activities at lunch time
- Early lunches until for the first few weeks
- Year 7 & 8 students leave school 5 minutes earlier than the older year groups
- Year 7 and Year 12 transition day in September prior to the rest of the school joining us
- A dedicated assistant head of year who is a non-teacher and avilable throughout the day
- Tutors are a vital part of our students lives as they check in every morning during our tutor time programme

Setting in Year 7



- Students are placed in a 'teaching group' from the start of the year. This is different from their tutor group
- The teaching group will change at the start of each academic year
- Majority of the timetable is in mixed ability groupings
- Mathematics is set in quarter year groups in Year 7 (based initially on Year 6 SATs results but then may be revised according to assessment scores in Maths)
- We will inform you about exact equipment needed (calculators are an important one and we don't want you wasting money on the wrong type)

Navigating our site



- Whilst it seems like a large site for Year 7 when they come to us in September we have lots of opportunities to support students when they arrive in navigating the site
- Their first day will be only Year 7 and 12, enabling us to walk them through the key areas of the site and for them to familiarise themselves with the Year 7 areas and faculty areas
- We have staff and older students across the site supporting students over the first few weeks and pointing them in the right direction
- They move as a teaching group, so all tend to support each other
- Their induction day in the summer term allows them to get a feel for the school, including different areas
- Year 7 students are surprisingly good at getting to know the site (better than some of the adults!)

Our school is so big!



Whilst it is factually accurate that we are a large school in all reality we do all that we can to ensure that all students are supported and recognised, regardless of the size of the school:

- We come together every Monday morning through my Headteachers broadcast
- Year 7 are managed and supported as a Year group when the first come in, allowing Mrs Wills and Mr Snow to get to know them all
- The Houses (which Year 7 transition into in May/ June time) are effectively 6 families within the school and the houses are all led by a Head of House and an Assistant Head of House. The House team get to know Year 7 really well during activities week where they will go with their Houses on Year 7 camp
- We support Year 7 by ensuring they have their own areas, but of course they can go where they want to and don't have stay in that area if they don't want to
- Just because we are a big school, it doesn't mean the children have more teachers they have the same number of teachers they would have in any other school
